


# Waiting lists in the NHS

The waiting list for planned hospital care – which stood at 7.68 million in July 2023 – has grown by 58% since just before the start of the pandemic

Monthly volume and share of treatments started in England, NHS compared with independent sector




Government spend on Independent sector 2006-2019



# Ophthalmology and orthopaedic treatment

In ophthalmology the independent sector has recovered from the pandemic disruption and expanded capacity whereas in orthopaedics, treatments remain below pre-pandemic levels

The Independent Sector delivered 31.2% of NHS funded orthopaedic care in February 2022
